features Although Photoshop is an imageediting application, you don't need to know Photoshop basics to use it. The following sections explain some helpful features to enable you to get up and running quickly. Going back to basics Some features of the program are pretty common to all computers, but you need to know a few things to get the most from Photoshop. Two common features are the following: Holding down a key combination or clicking the Home tab button (shown in the margin) and pressing Esc cancels the last action, or command. You can perform the same function on the keyboard or from the menu system. For example, in the Photoshop menu bar, choose Image⇒Image Size and click the

Resize icon (shown in the margin). Press Alt+Shift+Ctrl+i to access the Image Size window. Click the button labeled Reset and the process is repeated. The Home tab (shown in the margin) is a tab on the main Photoshop window. Located above the drawing area, it offers a series of shortcuts and commands to open various windows and panels. On the Home tab, choose Preferences from the View menu and navigate to the Commands section. This tells you how to access the current command. By default, the command is Set Default, which means that you can access any other command using this key combination. When you create an edit, or layer, you start to see the Edit Layers panel (where you create and modify

layers) under the Layers panel. To open the Edit Layers panel, click the panel's icon to expand it to see the Layers panel. Just above the drawing area, the bottom two icons provide the following controls: The little scissors icon (left icon) enables you to cut and paste areas and make other similar types of changes. If you are running an earlier version of Microsoft Windows, you can use the image viewer in that computer system or use an image viewer like GIMP, ImageJ, or Preview. Open the Microsoft Windows Photo Viewer by clicking the Start button, in the Windows task bar. 2. Open Photoshop Elements Launch Photoshop Elements by double-clicking the file you want to edit, and in the Photoshop Elements application, click on Edit. 3. Right-click and choose Edit in Adobe

Photoshop Elements 4. Now right-click on the image you want to edit, and choose Edit In Adobe Photoshop Elements. Note: You can also select the image and then press the right mouse button to open the left menu and choose Edit in Photoshop Elements 5. Use the Brush tool to paint in Photoshop Elements Note: To create a selection, make a selection (the brush icon), and then paint on the selection (the

paint bucket icon). Use the left arrow key to move to the next object, and use the right arrow key to move to the previous object. 7. To paint the background of the image, use the Select from Background tool and paint on the background of the image. Note: When you are finished, press the Escape key, and the selected area will be locked. Now you can close the image. 8. Select the Crop tool.
